### Sexual Health

#### Healthy Communities role in the HIV prevention revolution

Last month Chris gave us an edited version on the changes in HIV prevention. He asked us how, in an era of 'combination prevention', could the ambitious goal of halving HIV transmission or better be achieved?

One of the UN HIV prevention targets for 2015 is something we have a direct investment in achieving. That is, reducing the sexual transmission of HIV by 50%.

The others we also support, especially the impact of injecting drug use on HIV transmissions in Australia, but thankfully we have lead the world in the provision of clean injecting equipment and laws that allow their carriage. Regretfully many members of our community think that their drug use does not impact because it's not a hard drug like heroin or because it's legal like alcohol, but this is not always so. Drugs continue to impact in the decisions we make and directly on our health and we will continue to work with our community on their drug use.

Bill's one line solution was to lead by example and champion what we are doing in testing, treatment and education and this is something our staff, members and volunteers are committed to doing, but what does it mean in practice, for the work we do at Healthy Communities?

Bill suggests we update people with HIV about the emerging evidence concerning the health benefits of starting treatment early. I would add to that, that we need to update all gay men of this evidence; that someone on treatment is not likely to be able to transmit HIV and we need to inform our community on the reality of infection rates in Queensland today, because too many men still think it is a problem in Sydney or Melbourne but not Springwood or Mackay. Too many men also take other actions to reduce their risk and turn off from our presumed message of use a condom. Sometimes they get these other strategies wrong.

We are not the sex police, wanting to enforce the use of condoms in your sex play; but we do want people to make informed decisions on the level of risk they are willingly taking, and to know what to do if they make a mistake. It is not enough to guess if someone is negative, it is even worse if we use ineffective methods like withdrawal as a safety measure, so we will keep talking about the assurance of condoms for HIV and STI prevention and we will be informing people about the efficacy of the risk reduction strategies they are using.

Bill suggests we promote 'combination prevention' – consistent condom use and safe

injecting, as well as increasing PLHIV uptake of HIV treatment. I would add to that that every gay men needs to know of and be able to access PEP. Post Exposure Prophylaxis is proving to be very effective in stopping HIV taking hold once a potential transmission has occurred. If, in the heat of the moment you couldn't wait to find the condom. If he lied when he said he wouldn't come, or if the condom broke; quick action will stop HIV taking hold. PEP within 72 hours is very effective.

We also need to remind negative men that PLHIV on treatments are (by and large) unlikely to transmit HIV to their partners. This is what encouraging PLHIV onto treatment is about; the need to avoid positive men for fear of transmission risk is a thing of the past if we know they are on treatments for their HIV.

Finally Bill asks us to increase HIV testing campaigns and strategies like medico initiated HIV testing and rapid testing in community settings. Testing is the most exciting and challenging task we face. It's not the HIV positive men who are infecting others with HIV. It's the ones who think they are negative and proudly tell you so. They are not necessarily lying, but they are telling a truth out of context. Their negative status is based on their last test and for some men that was a long time ago.

People need to test frequently based on their number of partners and the frequency and type of sex they are having. We have been asking men about this for a while now and we know that men don't test for fear of needles, or because it takes too long and costs too much. Basically it's just not convenient and we are working hard to get rapid tests, quicker processes and more accessible testing options so that we can all test and know our status.

In his article Chris also talked about the need to fully exploit the potential of social media, mobile phones and the internet and this is another area that we have started working on. Last year saw the welcome addition to staff of Lyndal Cairns as our Social Media Coordinator and her impact shows in that this year most staff have facebook profiles, our websites are being updated and we have a plethora of specialised social media platforms so that we can reach members of our communities in the locations they wish to virtually congregate. This is an ongoing and every changing project as the ways of meeting and conversing with each other continue to expand and we will continue to review and respond to opportunities as they present.

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### Herding Cats – by Craig Atkinson

Somebody once said to me that both health promotion and community development were both a bit like herding cats – it's a tough job that never seems to be complete. Nevertheless it doesn't stop us from promoting health and making a difference within the community.

I have just started work at Healthy Communities on the Sunshine Coast working with Katie as a Health Promotion Officer for Gay MSM Sexual Health for Healthy Communities (formerly QAHC). Let's just see how easy it is to herd cats here!

I have approximately twenty years of experience in the health sector – working in hospitals across Australia, as well as sexual health in Darwin. Additionally I have run and managed my own business (a café which actively supported gay community events) as well as managing bars involving various event management roles.

As a gay man I feel I have an understanding of the difficulties LGBT (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender) people experience in their lives – either through difficulties in coming out, or discrimination within work or family life, or challenges of social isolation relating to sexuality. My passion is community development – I really enjoy being a part of bringing a community together.

On a personal note, my interests are art, music and cooking, and it would be fantastic to bring together my personal interests to my new role – perhaps through an art group, jam sessions, or even through lunches or dinners at our space we have here in Maroochydore.

My primary role is to work with the other Sunshine Coast staff to develop, a range of health promotion projects aimed at preventing the spread of HIV and other STI's among gay men and other men who have sex with men. I am based in Maroochydore, however the area I cover includes Caloundra, Caboolture, Gympie, Beerwah, Maleny, Nambour, Maroochydore, Coolum, Peregian Beach, Sunrise Beach and Noosa just to name a few.

Healthy Communities provide information and resources to the LGBT community statewide, as well as promoting visibility of LGBT people and their issues – in particular challenging homophobia, discrimination and inequity.

Through community development we encourage LGBT people to connect with each other in meaningful ways and help reduce social isolation and facilitate friendships. We have linked people to services to improve the health and wellbeing of our community and help fight HIV infection, address mental health issues and reduce suicide rates.

Currently Katie and I are organizing a Pool/Underwear Party at Hideaway Men's Resort Peregian Beach on the 18/02/2012 and planning a Men's Retreat for sometime in May/June.

So feel free to pop in and say hello – from there we can look at better ways of working with the LGBT people of Sunshine Coast – and hopefully make herding cats an easier task!

#### Well-Being Into the Future.

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## Once we were activists...

AIDS Councils came out of community activism. We took action to make change for people with HIV and those at risk of infection, their families and communities. We found we already had leaders in our midst, people with power they didn't even know they had. Together these people developed their activist skills so that we won changes to help people with HIV, and funding for ongoing support and prevention programs.

We did not always like the truth of a situation we were trying to change, how governments acted and what people thought of us, but we bowed to some of these truths, we compromised and we were, by and large, successful. In other words, we were realistic when we were trying to figure out what to tackle and we were honest about the things that stood in our way - externally and internally.

So it is today. Where once we shared a common goal of removing HIV, where we rebelled against powers that tried to direct our actions but we took money from the same people to ensure our goals could succeed. Now we have to ask who our communities are. What do we as LGBT Activists want to do and why do we do it?

Activism is about power and power is the ability to make things happen. Power means we can turn our convictions into real change. But activism to me, has always been rooted in collectivism and we stand at a point where we have to ask if we really want to act together, for all the letters of the sexuality and gender diverse world or just some of them?

Some of the lessons from the women's movement were about collectivism, they found that it's not enough to be "right"; believing something was correct did not put it in place. Like a school of small fish they worked collectively to frighten off the larger, predator fish, and like a school of fish they learnt that if one moved the wrong way, out of the collective, it was often eaten up.

As an LGBT Health agency we have to continually work at finding commonality and ensuring we act collectively. Society as a whole seems to be breaking down to individual expectations, looking out for number one; but this is the way to be eaten up, to lose the power of the collective and the ability to influence and make change. Instead we must listen to other voices and find ways to accommodate those voices within the LGBT world and the needs they express.

We still have leaders in our midst, but their goals and activism may be focused differently to ourselves. We may not always like the truth they show us about their concerns or our own prejudices, any more than we yet like the political situation we find ourselves in, but we have to find a way to accommodate and share with all our leaders, the goals they see as important, and if we join with them and help them in their fight, we can expect some collective help back in the ones we think are also important.

As a broader health agency we have to root our activism in respect for the commonality of each small interest groups, their fight, their authority and their leaders; so they are not subsumed in the bigger fights of the moment and so their causes are not lost in that endeavour. We have to develop strategies to increase the power of our allies and decrease the power of our opponents and we have to ask ourselves how we can communicate our beliefs and ideas while respecting process and experience, and how we can ensure that we follow through on what we commit to. Without this, we don't have a voice or an organisation that can demand change.

The Cairns Queer Film festival is now in its sixth year starting out as the Tropical Alternatives Regional film Festival(TAFF).Run in collaboration with TAFF, the Cairns Queer Film Festival Committee is taking on a role to help select films this year and as with other years, running and planning the two day event in Cairns.

Held at the JUTE Theatre at COCA the Cairns Queer Film Festival looks like having the best festival yet. Amongst some of the exciting films we have already managed to get for 2012 is Gen Silent, one of the most exciting films for 2012. This documentary is about the generation that fought the hardest to come out, is now going back into the closet to survive in nursing homes.

While gay parenting is a hot topic we bring you a film called Fatherhood Dreams highlighting the dream coming true for four gay parents.

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## 2Spirits – South

2 Spirits Program Outreach - The 2Spirits Brisbane team gave three separate presentations to students and staff at Southbank Institute of Technology in the month of February.

The first presentation was to students studying the unit “Working Effectively with Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander People” We presented to 80 non-indigenous students who were very interested in our program and the work we delivered and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures.

The 2Spirits team presented to 15 Indigenous students studying in the Human Service area undertaking the “diploma in Family Intake’.

Our presentation was based around a “As Potential Service Providers”. We highlighted the importance of keeping your personal opinions to yourself, professionalism and eliminating prejudice and NOT creating service gaps within services.

The final presentation at Southbank Institute of Technology were to 25 indigenous and non-indigenous high school students. Our presentation focussed on promoting the 2Spirits Program, Sexuality, Identity, the importance of Safe Sex and becoming advocates to their family and friends.

Through these workshops we will explore and develop appropriate ways of addressing sexual health issues as well as developing a new sistergirl resource.
